



## **Communiqué – ICP Council October 2019**

The ICP Council met in Shanghai China on 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> October 2019, prior to the 14<sup>th</sup> ICP Convention held at East China Normal University.

Fifty- Seven delegates from 15 different countries and 46 member associations attended the Council meeting.

### **1. ICP Welcome (for Executive, Council; Conferences; meetings of the ICP)**

The ICP Executive tabled their nominations for life membership to the Council confirming that both nominees had met the criteria as set out in the By-Laws.

**Life Memberships** were subsequently conferred by Council on Fiona Forbes and Rob Nairn for their contribution to ICP.

**Mr Tsutomi Shiozaki** (Life Member) presented the ICP Executive with a copy of the First International Convention: Principals of the World Learning Together (Geneva, Switzerland August 19 – 21 1993) Report. This book was donated by Mr Tatsuo NAGASHIMA, the first ICP vice President who still resides in Toyko and is 87 years old. We thank Tsutomi for bringing this wonderful artefact to the meeting and ask that he forwards our thanks to Mr Nagashima.
